The show, which contains over 50 new works, marks twenty-five years since Macdonald first began exhibiting at Portland Gallery.





Over that time, Macdonald has always remained true to her style, unswayed by fleeting fashions of the art world. Her paintings are as timeless as the landscape that surrounds her home, Crinan. For those collectors who have visited the family-run hotel over the last 56 years since the Ryans owned it, Macdonald's paintings offer a way to return. Macdonald's work has a clear dialogue with the tradition of the Scottish Colourists – artists such as Cadell, Peploe, and Maclauchlan Milne. Yet her paintings are unmistakably her own: tactile, elemental, and grounded in the lived in experience of the landscape rather than its picturesque surface. Macdonald sculpts paint into form, translating wind, tide, and rock into tangible texture.

The impasto surfaces of her canvases are as physical as the terrain they describe. While Scotland remains her enduring muse, this exhibition hints at a spirit of exploration – from the birds of the Galápagos to scenes glimpsed in France. Wherever she travels, her trusted palette knife and painter's eye goes with her. To mark twenty-five years of collaboration is to celebrate continuity, integrity, and an artist whose commitment to her vision has never wavered. Frances Macdonald's landscapes remind us that, even in the most familiar of views, there is always something new to see.

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Artist Biography

Frances Macdonald – born in Glasgow in 1945 Frances has exhibited with Portland Gallery for 25 years and her works continue to grow in popularity. From her studio overlooking the Corryvreckan, Macdonald has a clear view across the Sound of Jura to the north end of the island; to Scarba, the mountains of Mull before the great expanse of the North Atlantic. Having lived at Crinan for over 40 years Macdonald's painting is based on her intimate understanding of the landscape around her. Her knowledge of sailing informs her of approaching weather patterns, and she captures fleeting Hebridean sunshine alongside the winter squalls with equal immediacy. Peploe and Cadell's paintings of Iona cast a long shadow in Scottish art history, yet Macdonald has established herself as a worthy heir to the tradition started at the end of the 19th century.

Macdonald has served as a member of the Scottish Society of Painters in Watercolour and The Royal Glasgow Institute of The Fine Arts. In 2013 Frances was award the Charles Rennie Mackintosh residency at Collioure. Macdonald's paintings are featured in private collections worldwide.
