PORTLAND GALLERY ANNOUNCE EXHIBITION OF WORKS BY LACHLAN GOUDIE

Lachlan Goudie: Beyond the Blue Horizon 10th – 26th May 2023

Portland Gallery is delighted to announce an exhibition of paintings by Lachlan Goudie opening in May. Featuring over thirty works of tropical sunsets, sparkling seas and plush interiors, our show highlights the artist's ability to capture the vibrancy of his sun-drenched surroundings. In the footsteps of Scottish Colourist J.D. Fergusson, Goudie took to the South of France and Mauritius in search of dazzling landscapes; as Fergusson declared 'More sun, more colour!'. The exhibition celebrates an artist's escape from a cold autumnal London to warm exotic paradises. Highlights include the jewel-toned waters in *Treasure Island* and *Morning on the Mediterranean*, alongside colourful palm tree and banana plant vistas in *Paradise* and *Verandah*. Many of the works were painted on location using gouache on board, capturing Goudie's immediate and spontaneous response to the landscapes; the exhibition catalogue is formatted like an artist's sketchbook to echo their creation.

Artist Biography:

Lachlan Goudie (b. 1976)

Lachlan's artistic range is broad, he paints portraits, landscapes and still lifes. An ongoing project to document the extraordinary locations and landscape of Industrial Britain have seen him working in shipyards, steel works and satellite manufacturing laboratories. Lachlan's paintings have received numerous awards and are exhibited regularly in London, Edinburgh and New York. He is an elected member of the Royal Institute of Oil painters. In addition to painting Lachlan Goudie has written and presented several documentaries for the BBC. His landmark series 'The Story of Scottish Art' was critically acclaimed and Lachlan received a nomination from the Royal Television Society Scotland for the 'Onscreen personality of the year' award.

Other documentaries for BBC television include – 'The Art of Witchcraft' 'Stanley Spencer: The colours of the Clyde', 'Awesome Beauty: The Art of Industrial Britain', 'Painting the Holy Land' and 'Mackintosh: Glasgow's Neglected Genius' which was nominated in the best single documentary category at the Celtic Media awards, 2019.

Lachlan has been a judge across three series of BBC1's 'Big Painting Challenge' and reprised this role on BBC1's 'Celebrity Big Painting Challenge'. He is one of the presenters of the BBC's hugely popular 'Life drawing live', a live life drawing class which has been broadcast internationally.

Lachlan's first book, 'The story of Scottish Art', is published by Thames & Hudson and tells the story of 5,000 years of Scottish creativity.

Lachlan's writing is informed by his experience of working as an artist. He is a keen proselytiser for the value of technique and craft in contemporary art and was schooled in painting by his father, the artist Alexander Goudie.

Lachlan was born and grew up in Glasgow, Scotland, before studying English at Christ's College, Cambridge and Fine Art at Camberwell College of Art in London.
