In the light of the announcement of a £191m restoration of the Barbican, Nick Botting is interested in the value of what we have, of our cultural heritage, and of nursing and nurturing it. In a throwaway world, the Barbican and Venice are examples of a continuing heritage within which people live, and these paintings are an attempt to recognise that value.

The Barbican was designed with an Italian piazza in mind (calm open space, water, fountains and columns) and both London and Venice share the same history of being great sea trading ports.

Nick Botting has made the link with people going about their daily life in these two cities and the figures he records as a fleeting presence in this bigger picture.

At first glance, Botting's paintings focus on landscape, with rolling hills or expanses of architecture but upon inspection, it is the figures that bring the paintings to life. The inhabitants of the Barbican, the locals bartering in the Rialto market and the distant swimmers on beaches animate the space. There is a sense of spontaneity in these paintings, evident in the impressionistic mark-making, often using the smallest of brushes to evoke the ever-changing 'players' of a scene.
